- The NCP works independently, under the political responsibility of the minister for Foreign Trade and Development Cooperation. Working with independent members also means that the NCP work can be executed without being influenced by current government policy.
- The members of the NCP are appointed by the Minister after consultation of the key stakeholders and come from diverse segments of the Dutch society. This also means that each member brings their own expertise and network to the NCP, and can also use this to carry out the tasks of the NCP, including of course the promotional task to increase awareness and implementation of the OECD Guidelines.
- The advisory members of the NCP serve an important role as well to ensure the commitment of the Dutch government in the work of the NCP and to contribute expertise when needed.
- A well-equipped secretariat has proven to be essential to the effective functioning of the NCP as a whole. Ensuring adequate capacity and expertise as part of the secretariat has been important to

## 34. Do you have any updates on specific instances that were reported and not concluded in the previous reporting period?

Title	POSCO, ABP, APG, NBIM – Lok Shakti Abhiyan, KTNC Watch, Fair Green and Global Alliance, ForUM
Status	Concluded
Summary	The notification entailed an alleged breach of the Guidelines by South Korean Pohang Iron and Steel Company (Posco) and three of its investors: the Dutch pension fund ABP, its Pension Administrator APG and the Norwegian Bank Investment Management (NBIM). The notifying parties alleged that the Financial Institutions have not taken the appropriate steps to prevent or mitigate Posco's negative impacts on human rights and environmental rights which are directly linked to them through their financial relationship with Posco. More specific the notifiers claim that the Financial Institutions violated Chapter II, commentary 19 and 22, Chapter II, section A, paragraph 12 and paragraph 14, 20, 22 in the Commentary of General Policies.  In its Final Statement the NCP concludes that investors have a responsibility under the OECD Guidelines, even when they are only minority shareholders in a company, to exert influence where possible on companies they invest in to help prevent or mitigate possible adverse impacts of these companies' operations. The NCP concluded that APG, which manages the investments of ABP and other pension funds, has taken its responsibility as a minority shareholder and acted in accordance with the OECD Guidelines. However, constructive dialogue between POSCO and all stakeholders will be key to improve the situation on the ground. An independent Review and Assessment Mission could help launch such a dialogue. The Dutch NCP has expressed it's willingness to collaborate actively with the South Korean and Norwegian NCP to this end.

Title	Nuon Energy NV – FNV Eemshaven
Status	Concluded
	The notification entailed an alleged breach of the OECD Guidelines Chapter II, par.11,12,13 and Chapter V, par. 4a. Notifying parties submitted that NUON had violated the Guidelines by dealing with subcontractors who would not observe standards of employment not less favorable than those observed by comparable employers in The Netherlands.
Summary	The parties have reached a joint solution regarding the steps to be taken by Nuon to further increase its influence on the supply chain. They have agreed that Nuon will make changes to future contracts with its principal contractors in order to promote compliance with agreements throughout the supply chain. More specifically, this means that Nuon will require its principal contractors to impose the same obligations on their suppliers and subcontractors as those that

	Nuon imposes on its principal contractors with regard to conditions of employment, wage rates and compliance with national and European legislation.

Subjects among others: The Dutch government will get entitled to ask the NCP for a cross-company research on CSR issues in compelling situations where advice of the NCP is required to support the civil dialogue; Formalization of the regular working relationship with the key stakeholders (OECD Watch, Dutch BIAC-representative VNO-NCW and Dutch TUAC-representative FNV); Possible role of the NCP as facilitator or dispute settlement mechanism in CSR agreements with business sectors.
